Jeanne Marie Cratin passed away peacefully on September 27, 2023, after a long, difficult fight with cancer. She was the oldest daughter of John and Rebecca Cratin. In addition, she adored her nieces and nephews: PK Smith and partner Michael Brigoli; Hannah Stewart, husband Stephen Stewart, and daughter Teagan Stewart; and Cameron and Henri Alexander.

Jeanne was the consummate friend to anyone fortunate enough to call her one. The first to deliver a meal or help in time of need, Jeanne was tireless in supporting those she loved. Her family, cousins, and those around her often referred to her as one of the kindest, caring people they have ever encountered. Jeanne was known for her beautiful smile and her sincere interest in others. She was the type of person who asked how you were, listened to the answer, and carried your burdens with you.

Jeanne loved the beach, especially Cape Cod. She was given the gift of watching a sunset on the beach through FaceTime in the days before her passing. In Maya Angelou's 2008 book, Letter to My Daughter, she describes the enduring impact of a compassionate and generous spirit as: A great soul serves everyone all the time. A great soul never dies. It brings us together again and again. In honor of Jeanne's generous spirit, the family suggests that you donate to a charity of your choice in her name.

Gwynedd Friends Coffeehouse

Saturday, Oct 14/Saturday Nov 11. All shows 8:00 pm

The **Pour Rabbits** will be appearing on Oct 14. They are billed as "an upbeat, fun band that play a variety off Folk, Country, Jazz and Blues covers mixed with tasteful original songs. They are easily at home around a campfire." This five-piece Philadelphia-area band has been playing at various townships, fundraisers and colleges since 2004. On November 11th, the **Cornflower Jam** will appear. They began at jams and festivals around Philadelphia where they started playing and singling folk and old-time music. They describe their sound as influenced by folk legends such as the Careter Family, Pte Seeger, Malvina Reynolds, Rosalie Sorrels, Ollabelle Reed and Hazel Dickens as well as more modern American artists. Indigenous Peoples' Day Monday, October 9 11:00 am – 5:00 pm

The seventh annual **Indigenous Peoples' Day in Philly** is fast approaching. The event will be at Shackamaxon (Penn Treaty Park) on Monday, October 9, 2023, from 11 AM – 5 PM EDT. The event is hosted by Indigenous Peoples' Day Philly, Inc (IPD Philly), an Indigenous-led non-profit organization based in Philadelphia, PA. Through a celebration of art and culture, this annual event provides space for different Indigenous communities in the city to shed light on the history and strength of our people from 530 years of resistance.
